

## CLASSES SCHEDULE FOR 2020

The SJFWA will offer several classes this year for beginning and more advanced woodworkers.

If you have a class you would like to see included in this year's schedule or are willing to teach a class, please contact the club using the contact section of our web site. We would consider paid instructors from outside the club. While we are still working on classes for the year, two classes are penciled in as of now.

Introduction to scroll sawing - March 14, 2020. The class will be held at Tulare Western High School in Tulare. The instructor is Kevin Gerke. The class will be held from (9AM until noon). All necessary tools and supplies, including patterns, will be provided. There is no cost for the class. The instruction will start with the very basics like installing blades with the teeth down and you will learn all sorts of neat tricks like compound cutting and bevel cutting. Shaker Oval Boxes – Student will build a Shaker oval box. The date and time for this class is yet to be determined, but probably something in June at Tulare Western High School. The instructors will be All Sindlinger and Dave Summers. The Shaker oval box parts are included. Students will be required to make the forms and shapers for their box. The class is limited to 10-students, but we aren't taking sign-ups yet. This will be a three-session class. Cost of the class is to be determined but will consist of materials ordered, room rental and a small overhead.
